Supporting Teaching and Learning Through EANS Funding

In early 2021, the Emergency Assistance to Non-public Schools (EANS) relief program offered \$2.75 billion in funding to non-public schools across the U.S. Intended to help these schools bounce back from a difficult 2020, the program was expanded to include another \$2.75 billion in March 2021.

According to the Department of Education, EANS funds can be used for “activities related to safely reopening schools, continuing instruction, and addressing learning loss”. Put simply, there are many valuable ways these funds can be put to use – one way we can help is through professional development that will impact classroom and teacher experiences. We also offer products like FACTS Student Information System (SIS), which helps schools manage demographic and academic data, and facilitates in-person, distance, hybrid, or blended learning models through its native Learning Management System (LMS) or third-party LMS integrations like Google Classroom.

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LITERACY & COMPREHENSION PACKAGES

Focused primarily on improving elementary teachers, this series is all about reading. Each course included in this package comes with research-based strategies, downloadable instructional materials, and practical ways to create better classrooms.
